The Sound of Music



Among Calvary's blessings are our beautiful and functional buildings that serve our active church community well and are increasingly a resource for Golden and the Colorado School of Mines. Each of the three main gathering spaces—the Historic Church, the Great Hall, and the community rooms of the Ministry Center—would benefit and become even greater resources if the audio/visual systems serving these spaces were updated and enhanced.

The Historic Church hosts four services each weekend, weekday services, and a large majority of our weddings and funerals. The organ in the church is actually a practice instrument with limited and old technology. With the significant advances in audio technology, the newer digital organs are quite remarkable. After consultation and auditions, it was determined that the "Johannes Ecclesia" (a three manual digital organ) would meet the musical needs of the Historic Church for decades. The sound quality, range, and flexibility of the new organ will provide a high level of richness and support for worship and will be attractive to professional organists and chamber groups wishing to have concerts in the historic setting of the church. The instrument available has been used for demonstration and, therefore, is discounted in price. The total cost, installed and voiced to the space, is \$54,525. Already \$41,000 has been given/pledged! The final payment for this amazing new instrument is scheduled for December 25 of this year.

The Great Hall came into use in 2000. Since then, the sound system has been pieced together and is in desperate need of upgrading. The current system is easily overwhelmed and lacks flexibility and quality. Having an integrated system designed for the space would enhance Calvary's worship services in the Great Hall and would also make the space more attractive to outside groups to rent. Bids are currently being solicited for this project. Already \$2,000 has been given.

The Community Rooms of the Ministry Center are in increasing demand for a variety of uses. At one point, we looked into a permanently installed audio/visual system but have since determined that a portable system would make more sense given types of uses and the layout of the rooms. The total cost of a well-equipped portable a/v system will likely be met by the remaining receipts from last year's *Special Campaign* (\$5,488). Thank you to all who participated in this campaign!

With the completion of these three projects, the audio/visual capabilities in our buildings will be brought to a level of excellence and will serve Calvary and the Golden community for many years to come.

In September, we will be launching the *Sound of Music* campaign to complete the funding for these projects. If you wish to contribute now, please do not hesitate! If your preference is for either the Historic Church organ or the Great Hall sound system, please indicate so on your check/pledge.

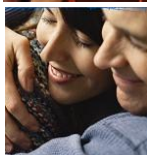

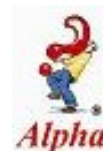

It's Back-to-School at Calvary, Too!

Christian Ed Resumes September 11th, 10:10 to 11:00 am!

We are busy making plans for another exciting year in Sunday school! Children ages 3 years – 12th grade must re-register every year in order to attend classes. Tables will be set up outside the classrooms on the lower level of the Great Hall on the first day for registration. If you have a child in middle or high school, we ask that you please register with their teacher.

Two years ago, a dedicated team of individuals worked hard to write a curriculum specific for students from pre-school through sixth grade. This year we will focus on New Testament stories. Our hope is that by the time students enter middle school, they will have a good understanding of the major themes of the bible. Copies of the curriculum are available if you are interested.

Our middle school class (7th/8th grade) will be participating in the year-long course "Cross-Training", beneficial in its own right, but which also serves as preparation for any young people who wish to be confirmed or baptized. An informational meeting about confirmation/baptism will be offered at the beginning of the semester.

The high school class will focus on biblical application; how do we take what we have learned all these years and apply it practically? Lively discussion is the norm!

Your child will be eager to tell you what they are learning – please ask them! If you are excited about Sunday school, they will be, too. Include Sunday school in your Sunday dinner conversation. It is a great way not only to find out what your child is learning, but also to start up discussions about the stories in the Bible. In my house,

this has sparked some lively discussion about what it might have been like to live in Biblical times, how each of us interprets the story, and how that story speaks of how we should live our lives as Christians.

Once again we have been blessed with an incredibly gifted group of teachers. They have all been thoroughly trained and are looking forward to working with the students this year. Please take the time to thank the teachers for their commitment - it is huge!

Our vision for the children is to help them develop a close and personal relationship with God, leaving a lasting imprint of God's love for each and every one of them. We cannot do this without your help. We ask that you not only make a commitment to bring your child to Sunday school, but also to pray for the teachers, and to talk with your child about what they are learning. 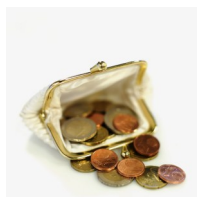

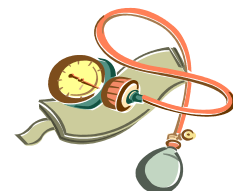


Volunteers Needed for St. Francis Center Sunday, September 25th
